Message from our Minister...

I was writing an appointment the other day for October, and I said to Caz 'where on earth has the year gone?' It is amazing how fast time flies for us sometimes; but of course, this is only our sense of time, as we all know it is always the same. I was thinking that this same phenomenon occurs in a variety of ways in life. Our senses sometimes seem out of touch with the reality of life; what we feel isn't the same as what we see or hear or touch or taste. This truth is often used effectively within cuisine or artistic works to create a sense of imbalance or discomfort; playing with our senses.

But what about spiritually? Is there a possibility that our sense of God can be out of step with the reality of who He is and what He does? Do our senses and feelings sometimes dictate our beliefs, rather than allowing biblical teaching or theological understanding to do so? It is so important for us to stand firm in our faith on the foundation of scripture, and what it alone tells us about God, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit. If we start to allow our feelings, what we sense, to dictate what we believe, we are in danger of ending up rejecting the truth. This is why it is so valuable for all of us to regularly, and prayerfully, read our bibles. This is our way of saying to God, 'please guide me into Your truth, even when I find it uncomfortable'.
