Message from our Minister...

A young boy was sitting in the back seat of the car eating an apple. He poked his father in the front seat and asked, "Daddy, why does my apple turn brown?" His father answered, "When the skin is removed from the apple, air reaches the flesh of the apple and causes oxidation. This changes the apple's molecular structure and results in a brownish colour." After a pause, a small voice from the back seat asked, "Daddy, I don't understand, were you talking to me?"

I often feel like that boy! I want solutions to the confusing problems I run up against, but I often don't understand the answers. I want someone to explain how to get through the difficult times so that I can get it right! But I want it explained simply. I think I identify more with the father whose daughter asked him if he would help her with some homework. "I'm sorry," he replied. "It wouldn't be right." "Well," she said, "at least you could try."

We often don't have all the answers, and hard as we try, we can't always get it 'right.' But our faith and trust in God means that one of the most wonderful answers we DO have is that: we don't HAVE to always get it right! All we are required to do is give it our best; then learn from the experience and go on. This is learning from what life throws at us; this is walking with our God. May He help us this week, as we seek to trust Him and strengthen our faith.
